

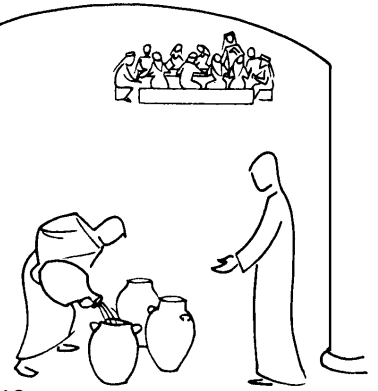

Next Sunday is the **Fourth Sunday of Epiphany.** The **Holy Eucharist** will be celebrated in St Margaret's at 8am and 9.30am, and at St Edward's at 11am, with **Sung Evensong** at St Margaret's at 6pm and **Choral Evensong** at St Edward's at 7pm. Eucharist readings: Nehemiah 8: 1-3, 5-6, 8-10; 1 Corinthians 12: 12-31a; Luke 4: 14-21.

EVENING PRAYER will be said on Monday at 6pm and Thursday at 7.15pm this week. Morning Prayer on Saturday at 9am.

ANTHEMS. The anthem at the Eucharist is "O taste and see" by Sir Arthur Seymour Sullivan (1842-1900). The Introit at Evensong is "A Prayer of St Richard of Chichester" by Leonard J. White (1910-197?), and the anthem is the setting of Agnus Dei from "The Armed Man: a Mass for Peace" by Sir Karl Jenkins (b.1944).

HEATHER WRITES: I feel excited and extremely privileged to be representing the Church in Wales on this visit to Egypt with an ecumenical group of women, to explore Embrace the Middle East's projects supporting women and girls.

We will be spending the week in Cairo and Alexandria, to see and hear at first hand the stories of those who are able to benefit from the Embrace charity's work to combat poverty and inequality in Egypt and nearby countries.

Journeying with women from the Church of England, the Catholic and Methodist churches, to visit Coptic Christians in the places inhabited by the Desert Fathers and Mothers will be a unique pilgrimage.

I will also be following in the footsteps of Bishop Llewellyn Gwynne, a Welshman who in 1920 became the first Anglican Bishop of Egypt and the Sudan, and was ahead of his time in promoting the education of girls and rights of women.

I look forward to bringing back a deeper understanding of ways we can help women and girls through our support and prayers for Embrace projects.
