Next Sunday is Candlemas. The Holy Eucharist will be celebrated in St Margaret's at 8am and 9.30am, and at St Edward's at 11am, with **Choral Evensong** at St Edward's at 6.30pm.

HIS MAJESTY KING CHARLES has approved the appointment of our organist Norman Doe as honorary King's Counsel. The award is made to those who have made 'a major contribution to the law of England and Wales'. Professor Doe was nominated 'for reviving the study of Ecclesiastical Law in England and Wales', among other things. The Lord Chancellor will preside over the appointment ceremony at Westminster Hall at the Houses of Parliament in March 2024.

THE BISHOPS OF THE CHURCH IN WALES are calling for the development of a "shared vision" for the future of Wales as they respond to the publication of a major report on the Constitution. They say a "strong consensus" about society will help Wales face its challenges with confidence. The bishops also pledge their practical and prayerful support to the ongoing discussion. ST EDWARD'S ORGAN PROJECT. The electrical work is complete, and the pipes are back in place. Work is proceeding this week to replace the bellows, after which the scaffolding can be removed. We are planning to perform Fauré's Requiem in the context of a Devotional Service on Good Friday, with choir, orchestra and organ. 100 years ago today, on Mon 21 Jan 1924 at 7.30pm, the Bishop of Llandaff dedicated the new organ at St Edward's, built by Charles Gill at a cost of £1200, raised by the members of the church. It was described at the time as "one of the most important organs completely built in Cardiff for the last 30 years".
